There are so many meaningful Jewish rituals woven into a wedding ceremony, and you have your hands full!

This **optional** collection takes work off your plate, connects your family to the process, and leaves you with fun and personal keepsakes you can bring home and use for years to come.

WHAT THIS INCLUDES

- 1 Smash Glass • Personalized Mezuzah • Handwritten Hebrew Scroll**
I provide a **1.** colorful smash **glass** (or two!) that I install into a **2.** custom **mezuzah** for your home and a **3.** handwritten Hebrew parchment **scroll** prepared by a trained scribe.
- One of Judaism's central prayers, the Shema/V'ahavta, instructs us to hang the words of the prayer on the doorposts of our homes; that's the mezuzah. Made with your broken wedding glass, your mezuzah will be a special reminder of your wedding day.
- 4 Rabbi & Parent Conversations**
One or both sets of your parent(s) have the option to meet with me, either with you or separately, to help them feel informed, comfortable, and connected to the ceremony.
- 5 Custom Kippot/Yarmulkes • Kiddush Cup • Modern Challah Cover**
I will handle the order for 60 personalized kippot for your ceremony. I will also provide a beautiful kiddush cup and a modern, ^{*}made-in-USA challah cover from Arielle Zorger Designs.

This collection is designed to make the ritual pieces feel thoughtful, grounded, and easy, so you can focus on getting married!





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All the Details (1 of 2)

1. Smash Glass & 2. Personalized Mezuzah

I will provide one or two colorful, easy-shatter smash glasses in cloth bags for safe stomping under the chuppah. After the ceremony, I will carefully collect, sort, and arrange the broken glass by hand inside an artistic mezuzah. You'll have a memorable, one-of-a-kind mezuzah for your home together.

3. Handwritten Mezuzah Scroll

One of Judaism's central prayers, the Shema/V'ahavta, instructs us to hang the words of the prayer on the doorposts of our homes. To elevate this ritual, we've developed the custom of a decorative mezuzah to hold these words. The Hebrew words inside your custom mezuzah are handwritten by a trained scribe on a parchment scroll, turning a moment from your wedding ceremony into a daily reminder of your Jewish values and connectedness.

4. Rabbi & Parent Conversation

Before the wedding, I can meet with one or both sets of parent(s), either with the couple or privately, to help them feel informed, comfortable, and connected to the ceremony. We'll walk through the ceremony flow, set expectations, and answer questions big or small: from where to stand, to whether a non-Jewish parent should wear a kippah, to the meaning behind each ritual. It is also a chance for your parents to put a face to a name and process any feelings about this significant milestone!

Note: this is completely optional. And whether or not you choose this Under the Chuppah collection, I am always glad to answer questions throughout the process.

5. Personalized Kippot/Yarmulkes

I will handle the order for 60 personalized kippot for your ceremony. Depending on your wedding aesthetic and time of day, I usually recommended raw silk or satin, and I'll help you narrow down the exact choice. The finished kippot can be placed in a basket for guests who would like to wear one.

Note: providing/wearing kippot is not a requirement for your ceremony, but many people choose to provide them. 60 is the minimum order, and it is usually plenty: but I am happy to order additional kippot at cost if you would like extras for guests or as keepsakes.

6. Kiddush Cup

During your ceremony, we will share a short blessing over a glass of wine. It is customary to use a kiddush cup to elevate this ritual, and I encourage you to use a personal or family kiddush cup if you have one! As part of this package, I will also provide a beautiful kiddush cup of your own, which can be used during the ceremony if you do not have another cup in mind. Your first kiddush cup as a couple: for Shabbat, holidays, and celebrations for years to come.

7. Challah Cover

You will receive a beautiful made-in-USA challah cover from Arielle Zorger Designs, chosen to feel colorful, modern, and meaningful. You may use it during your wedding meal and then bring it home for Shabbat, holidays, and family gatherings.
